Gerald Ouma (PhD)



Gerald has published in *Higher Education Studies*, the most prestigious journal in higher education studies, he has been appointed Associate Professor at the University of the Western Cape (UWC), and he coordinates the new Institute of Post-School Studies at UWC (the only such faculty in Africa that will address post-secondary education). In 2012 he served on the Funding Review Committee, and contributed to the Minister of Higher Education's Funding Review report.

Patrício Langa (PhD)



Patrício is publishing a book on higher education in Lusophone Africa, has established the first Masters degree in education at Eduardo Mondlane University (EMU) (with the University of Oslo and UWC), is Deputy Director of the HE Quality Committee of Mozambique, and is coordinating a new strategic plan for EMU. He is also the Director of the Sociological Association of Mozambique and of a Mozambican higher education research NGO. He and Francois have jointly set up a publishing NGO in Mozambique.

Thierry Luescher-Mamashela (PhD)



Thierry is well represented on the HERANA publication list with several publications including a book, journal articles and articles in the media. Thierry has become part of the Global Research University Network on the Student Experience and has been doing student leadership development across the country.

Danwood Mzikenge Chirwa (PhD)



Danwood is currently the new Head of the Department of Public Law, professor and junior fellow at the University of Cape Town. He serves on the Advisory Boards of the Constitutional Court Review, and is the founder and Editor-in-Chief of the *Malawi Law Journal*. Danwood has published on various human rights issues and is participating in the HERANA project analysing the legal frameworks of the National Higher Education Commissions in the participating HERANA countries. He has collaborated with international and African-based NGOs, such as the Rights and Democracy (Canada), Community Law Centre (South Africa), African Child Policy Forum (Ethiopia) and ESCR-Net (USA).

Rómulo Pinheiro (PhD)



Rómulo has been appointed as associate professor in public policy and administration at the University of Agder in Norway. He is also a senior researcher at Agderforskning/the Centre for Advanced Studies in Regional Innovation Strategies and a visiting professor at the University of Oslo, where he teaches and supervises in the master of higher education studies programme. Rómulo's recent publications include an edited book volume on the role of universities in regional development, as well as numerous book chapters and journal articles on issues related to higher education dynamics, governance, management and engagement. He is currently working on two international, comparative research projects, one investigating the changing dynamics of higher education across the BRICS countries and the other shedding light on the effects of mergers processes involving higher education institutions across the Nordic region.

Tracy Bailey (Masters)



Tracy wrote nine reports and co-edited two books for HERANA I. She co-wrote a book chapter with Francois drawing on research on development-related projects at the HERANA universities. She is currently writing the definitive report on national higher education commissions in Africa and is part of the team writing a US\$3 million funding proposal to Dfid on evidence-based reform in African higher education.

Francois van Schalkwyk (Masters)



Francois is publishing a chapter on university engagement in a book on transformation of higher education in South Africa, is the research lead on a project with the IDRC/Web Foundation on the relationship between open data on higher education and university governance, and is doing research for UCT on increasing the visibility of academics at the University of Mauritius. He has developed an African higher education policy and research portal, and has developed by far the best higher education website in Africa.

Samuel Fongwa (Masters)



Sam is currently doing his PhD at the University of the Free State. He has recently co-authored the two-volume SARUA profile of SADC higher education and has co-written a chapter on higher education and regional development with Gerald.
