Differentiation is a central issue facing higher education in South Africa. However, this is not only a South African issue. At the CHER conference (September 2006, Kassel Germany) the theme of the conference was “System Convergence, Institutional Diversity” and most of the big names in higher education studies spoke about it – Teichler, Scott, Van Vught, Dill. From these discussions it became clear that a discussion about differentiation, or diversity, needs to be contextualised within a broader socio-political, system governance and funding framework. During discussions with a number of prominent persons in higher education it has become clear that there is a need for informal dialogue between different stakeholders. The dialogue will be, as is the tradition with CHET, not between constituencies, but amongst a group of high level participants who can exchange views without representing stakeholder positions.
